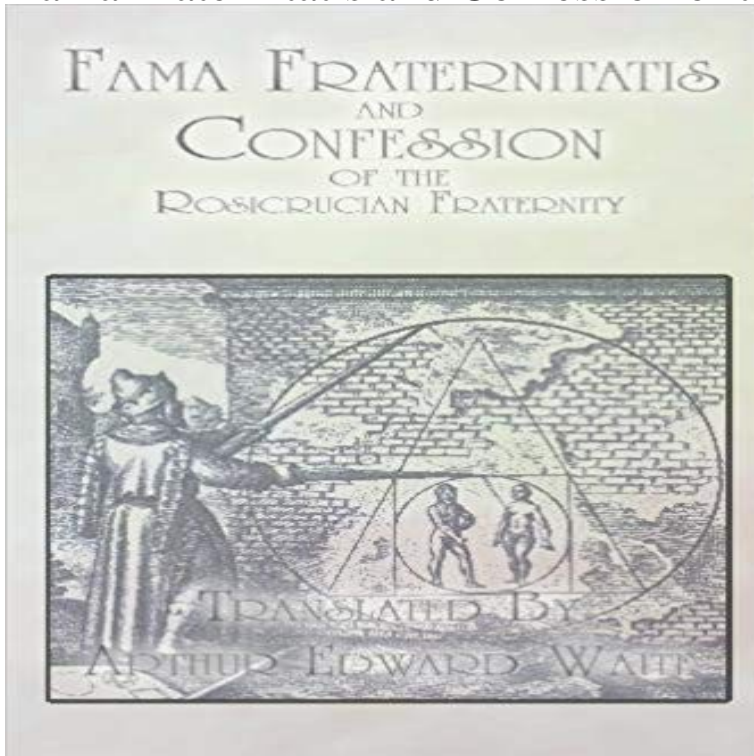


Fama Fraternitatis and Confession of the Rosicrucian Fraternity
