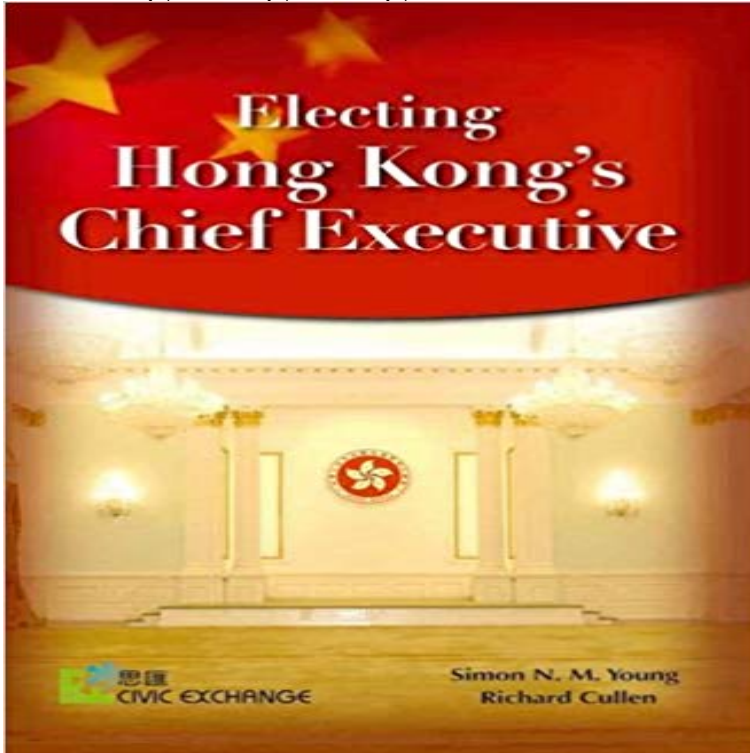


Electing Hong Kongs Chief Executive
