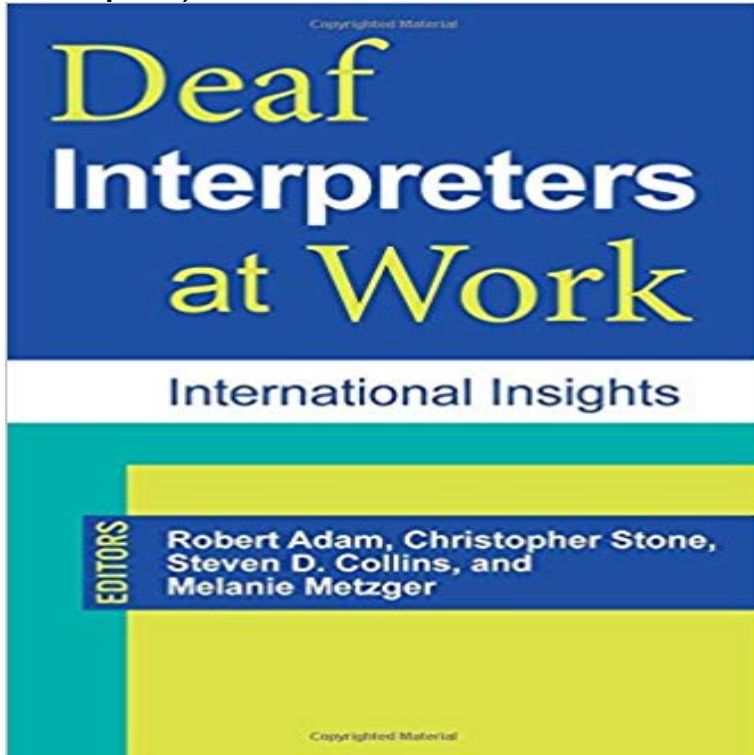


# Deaf Interpreters at Work: International Insights (Gallaudet Studies In Interpret)
