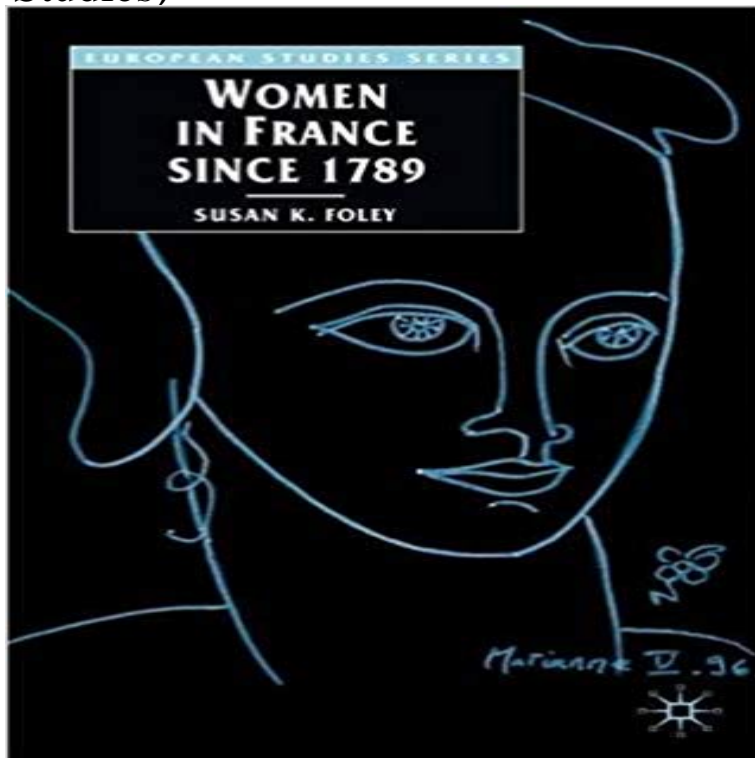


Women in France since 1789: The Meaning of Difference (European Studies)
